I just want to focus on getting my feet under me and slowly adjust back into society. When I get off of work, I just want to be so exhausted I just want to go home and relax.

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Sir, as I stated earlier. I thank you and your staff for a job well done under a difficult situation. I am grateful.

I sit here with a positive attitude, as I always have, and I will work the program here to where it will help me in my future.

I must close now. I will contact you right before I am released so we can possibly make an appointment so we can go over my parole stipulations, if that offer still stands.
